7. How many states cast their electoral votes for Lincoln?

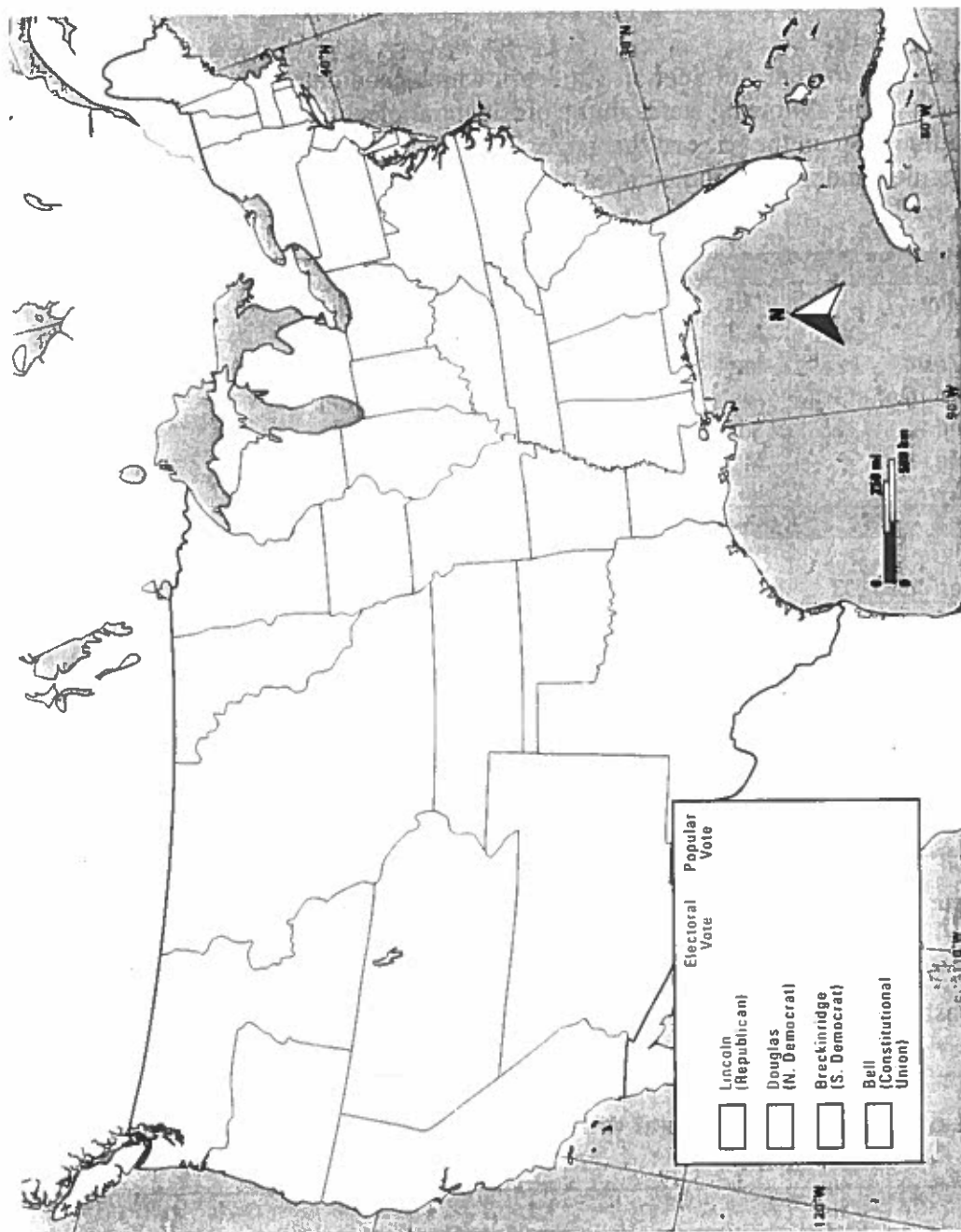
8. IF the Democratic party had not split, would Lincoln have won the election?
