f) According to the Constitution, what group of people decide who wins the Presidency if there is no majority?

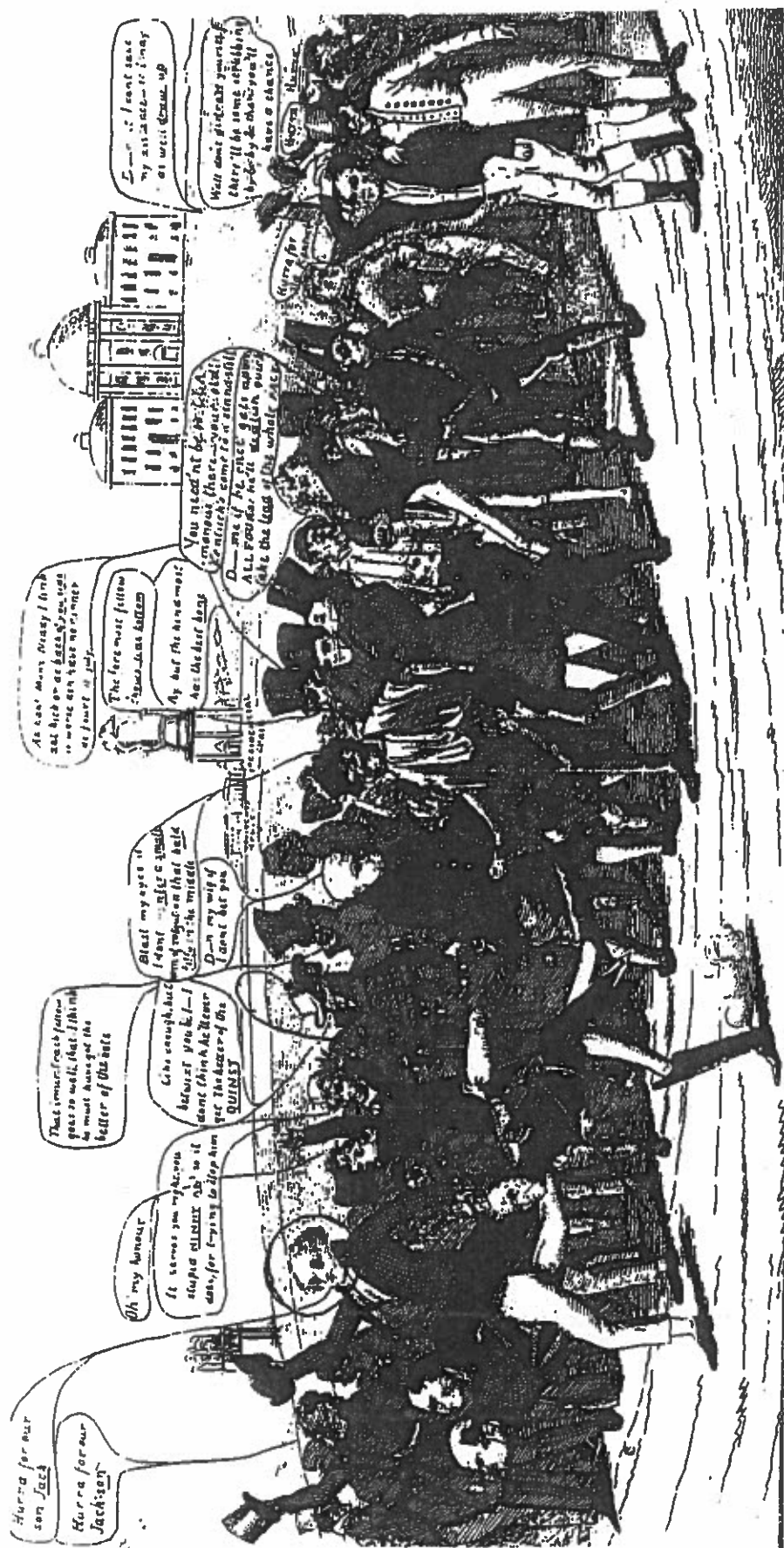
