
**Friday** February 5 – "In our Faculty & Staff" Breakfast/snacks for Faculty/Staff/Administration and a dress down day for the volleyball games.

On the date of January 27<sup>,</sup> 1945 the Jewish people were finally liberated from Auschwitz Nazi Concentration Camp. To commemorate this day and honor all those who suffered, the United Nations created the international holiday of Holocaust Remembrance Day. Auschwitz was the largest of the death camps. Six million Jews were murdered by Germany's Nazi regime, along with 5 million non-Jews who were killed. Ceremonies to honor this day are in various countries including ours, which is held at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, DC. During these ceremonies there are candle-lightings and the reading of the victims' names. It's a very emotional ceremony for the young and the old alike. This is a necessary day to remind humankind never to let anything like this happen again.



#### MARIAN CATHOLIC KICKS OFF MINI-THON

Marian Catholic High School kicked off its 1<sup>st</sup> annual mini-THON, a fundraiser which is modeled after the Penn State IFC/Panhellenic Dance Marathon (THON), making a difference in the lives of childhood cancer patients and their families for more than 20 years, with a rally on December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2015. The mini-THON will raise money that will support children that are battling cancer. The event will be held from 7 p.m. on April 15 to 9 a.m. on April 16 in the high school gymnasium.

Olivia Palmieri, the overall co-chairperson for the event, introduced Four Diamonds representative, Leigh Anna Hilbert, who spoke to our student body explaining what Mini-Thon is and how it began:

"The Four Diamonds Fund was set up by Charles and Irma Millard, a Lancaster County couple, after the death of their son, Christopher, who was 11 years old when he was first diagnosed with cancer. Shortly before he lost his three-year battle with cancer, he wrote a story about a great knight who must find the four diamonds of Courage, Wisdom, Honesty, and Strength in order to defeat the evil sorceress, which represents cancer."

All committee chair people were then introduced to the student body. They are: Overall - Olivia Palmieri and Timothy Busher; Communications - Camryn Wilson and Samantha McCarthy; Morale - Teague Schmidt; Finance - Megan Ferrello; Rules and Regulations - Nikki Kline and Juliana Oberto; Hospitality - Michaela Susko and Clarissa Colondo; Operations - Gabreille Tout; Entertainment - Alexandria Dutz and Angelina Krupko.

Olivia also explained the big picture of Marian's first Mini-Thon; that no matter whom you are or what you're involved in, you can be a part of this and make a difference "For the Kids." Megan Ferrello spoke briefly on establishing a "Donor Drive" account, an online platform used for tracking all funds raised by the individual participants. Communications chair, Cami Wilson, informed the student body of a contest to design a logo to be used by this year's theme: CARNIVAL FOR A CURE! The event was concluded with a fun game, involving the student body, of Human Hungry Hungry Hippos!
