SAP Team Provides Assistance to All Students

In Pennsylvania, every school district is required to have a plan for identifying and assisting students who experience "barriers of learning." The Secretary of Education established the Student Assistance Program as a Pre-K through 12th grade system for assisting parents and school personnel in removing those barriers. A SAP team, made up of school and agency staff, is available to help students and their families receive access to school and community services for all Marian Catholic students.

Marian's SAP team is comprised of several teachers: Ms. Bechtel, Mr. Valente, Mr. Ceci, Mr. Smith, Ms. Meehan, and Ms. Martini, administrator: Mr. Sanfilippo, and school counselor: Ms. Dunn. Marian's SAP team will help students in need find services and assistance within the school and, if needed, in the community. The SAP team's purpose is to provide students and families with information to assist their child. The SAP team is entirely confidential, and respect the family and child's privacy at all times.

If you feel that a student may need help, contact the school and ask to speak with a member of the SAP team. Someone will be there to help.



This year we had a decorating contest for Christmas. Each class hallway would be judged. These are some of the decorations to be seen. Freshmen of course won the dress down day.







