The links below focus on instructional classroom resources that support the Career Education and Work Standards, as well as portfolio evidence for the Career Readiness Indicator.

Pennsylvania CareerZone

Pennsylvania Department of Education's free online tool assists students with career awareness, exploration, and planning, such as the Interest Profiler, Work Importance Profiler, and Assess yourself assessment, as well as comprehensive information on 900 occupations and career readiness tools.

Pennsylvania Career Guide (Department of Labor and Industry)

For 26 years, the Center for Workforce Information & Analysis has provided resources for educators and job seekers to explore careers and interests in a self-assessment, to research occupations in Pennsylvania and post-secondary options, and to plan for future success using effective tools and guidelines.

Career Posters (Department of Labor and Industry)

Colorful classroom posters are available for each of the Pennsylvania Workforce Development Areas (WDAs) and include one poster for each of the 12 industry clusters, as well as wage and annual opening data.
