- A. Introduction (1 sentence)
 - 1. Includes the author's name
 - 2. Includes the title of the published work
 - 3. Includes an overview of the author's argument (main idea)
 - 4. Example: This week's article of the week, "New Technology," discusses new robotic advances in technology and examines the use of robo-cheetahs, robotic prison guards, and DNA robots.
- B. Says-Means (2-3 sentences)
 - 1. Provides direct references to the text
 - 2. Explains what the text means in your own words
 - 3. Example: The text states, "...researchers from Harvard University have created tiny nano-sized 'DNA Robots' that can be instructed to hunt and destroy cancer cells" ("New Technology" 1). This advancement in technology provides hope in finding a cure for cancer.
- C. Matters (1-2 sentences)
 - 1. Explains the significance of the quote or reference to the text
 - 2. Connects the textual reference back to the author's argument
 - 3. Example: The significance of this finding shows that robots can help mankind progress in many ways, and technology is moving forward.
- D. Mechanics and Usage
 - 1. Written in complete sentences using capital letters, punctuation, correct spelling and correct grammar.
 - 2. Emphasis is placed on using <u>commas correctly in compound, complex, and compound-complex sentences</u>.
