# **Standard Coding**



- 1 indicates the content area. In this case, it's Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening (the first number matches the numbers we just saw in the previous slides).
- 4 is the standard area (RWSL has 9 standard areas)
- 3 is the grade level of the standard
- A is the descriptor that identifies the specific standard statement

## **Assessment Anchor Coding**



- R indicates Reading anchor
- 3 is the grade level of the anchor
- A is the reporting category Comprehension and Reading Skills. Trainers may want to discuss the reporting categories for the other standards...
- The next number 1 is the assessment anchor- and defines the skill that is assessed on the PSSA- Describe and interpret literary elements within and among texts.
- The final number 1 is a descriptor which further describes what is assessed Compare characters, settings and plots.
- Assessment Anchor Definition the part of the PA academic standard that is eligible to be assessed on the PSSA.
  They clarify the relationship between standards and assessments. There are components of the standards that are
  not able to be assessed on large scale assessment (i.e., fluency is not able to be assessed on a large scale
  assessment).
