CHART - ARGUMENTS REGARDING SECESSION WHY SOUTH CAN SECEDE WHY SOUTH CAN'T SECEDE

- 1) Since states had voluntarily joined the U.S., they could leave
- 2) Abolition President threatened their slave based economy.
- 3) Northern majority would force the South to abolish slavery.

- 1) Federal gov't, not states, was sovereign
- 2) Would make U.S. weaker
- 3) Majority rule South unwilling to live with results.
- 4) Not allowed per the Constitution
