The <u>CommonLit</u> Literacy Model is built on a foundation of over 2,000 high-quality free reading passages for grades 3-12, complemented by aligned interim assessments, growth-oriented data, and expert-led teacher development. Currently offering 4 weeks of lesson plans. This does require a registration but is **free**.

<u>ReadWriteThink.org</u>, from the National Council of Teachers of English, is a **free** searchable collection of "traditional" instructional resources, access to student interactive items and mobile apps for accessing learning activities. Grades K-12.

Smithsonian Tween Tribune

<u>Smithsonian Tween Tribune</u> (grades K-12) offers the option to create a **free** account and set up a class. Students can sign into your class. The teacher may assign articles which are accompanied by quizzes and monitor responses to articles through the dashboard.

Scholastic Learn at Home

<u>Scholastic Learn at Home</u> provides **free** day by day projects to keep kids reading, thinking and growing (grades PreK – 9). Learn at Home provides 20 days' worth of active learning journeys designed to reinforce and sustain educational opportunities. New learning experiences are built around a story or video daily. Activities are divided into four grade spans: pre-K and kindergarten, grades 1-2, grades 3-5, and grades 6-9.

Students can access dozens of <u>TED Talks</u> to learn about a variety of topics. <u>TED-Ed</u> includes lessons, graphic organizers, and reflective questions. Listening and reflecting on TED Talks can be great ways for students to practice writing and speaking (via recordings) in response to sources, using evidence from the text. Remember that videos, images, and recordings like TED Talks *are* texts. The TED Talks can also be used as a launch for students creating their own TED Talk.

Audible Stories

<u>Audible Stories</u> is a **free** website where kids of all ages can listen to hundreds of Audible audio titles across six different languages—English, Spanish, French, German, Italian and Japanese.

Digital Public Library of America (DPLA)

To read **free** e-books, download the SimplyE app for iOS or Android and add Digital Public Library of America as your library to access the DPLA Collection. It provides access to more than 5,000 free ebook titles. DPLA also provides access to Primary Source Sets that explore topics in history, literature, and culture developed by educators, complete with teaching guides.

Epic!

A digital library for ages 12 and under, <u>Epic</u> is like a Netflix for books. Resources include text-to-speech, quizzes, learning videos, and more. Books can be saved to the app to be accessed without internet. Parents and educators can track student progress. Epic is offering this **free** for educators and a free month for families.

Supporting the Home Environment

REL – Reading at Home

The Regional Educational Laboratory provides **free** resources for <u>Supporting your</u> <u>Child's Reading at Home.</u> The Family Activities at home can help children develop language, link sounds to letters, blend letters and word parts to read and write words, and read for understanding. Supports are provided for Kindergarten through third grade.

Starfall

<u>Starfall</u> is the perfect website for kids who are learning the basics or in the early stages of independent reading. Most of the resources are **free**, although there is a paid section that gives you access to additional resources. There are printable books, online games, and writing journals.

ABCYa

This website offers academic games for kids from PreK-5. <u>ABCYa</u> was created by teachers. It offers a free subscription and never collects personal data.

FUNBRAIN

<u>Funbrain</u>, created for kids in grades Pre-K through 8, offers hundreds of free interactive games, books, videos, and printable resources that help kids develop skills in reading, math, and problem-solving.
