





Nomination criteria:


- Nominees must be in grades 8–12.
- Only individual students can be nominated, not groups.
- Students cannot be nominated by a family member.
- Students must be in public, private, parochial, or home school in the United States.

Remake Learning Days is gearing up for another great year! Consider how your school can get involved, secure fun CEW artifacts and engage your entire community in hands-on learning!

Remake Learning Days (RLD) is an innovative statewide learning festival held each year from May 1-23, 2026, that provides hands-on learning experiences for families and youth, fostering a sense of preparedness and a means of introducing learning resources within communities. Remake Learning Days events are open to the public, and families, schools, and after school organizations are encouraged to share the RLD events to their networks.



As K-12 students participate in RLD events that are part of the **Career Ready PA Backpack Challenge** (look for the backpack logo!), the students can earn badges for their career readiness portfolio *after they complete PDE's digital artifact survey*. If a school has at least 100 students who earn badges, then they will receive a banner from PDE for their efforts in meeting the **Backpack Challenge!** [Be sure to register!](#)

Career Ready PA will award ten (10) \$1000 awards to schools who host a festival event (one in each region). Host participants will be required to complete a participation plan, ensuring the event reaches its goal of addressing the current and newly revised **Career Education and Work Standards** by providing a hands-on learning event during the Remake Learning Days festival between May 1-23, 2026. The host/s should partner with the Career Ready PA liaison and one or more community organization/s (e.g., a business, a state agency, a community non-profit, museum, library). 
