PROCLAMATION

DONATE LIFE MONTH

April 2021

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania strongly supports organ and tissue donation because of its life-saving and life-enhancing opportunities; and

WHEREAS, more than 7,000 men, women, and children in Pennsylvania are waiting for a life-saving organ transplant; and

WHEREAS, 687 generous donors from the commonwealth gave the gift of life in 2020; and

WHEREAS, nearly half of all Pennsylvanians have demonstrated their support of donation by registering as organ, tissue, and cornea donors; and

WHEREAS, one organ and tissue donor may save up to eight lives, restore sight to two people, and heal the lives of seventy-five others; and

WHEREAS, people of all ages are considered potential organ and tissue donors; and

WHEREAS, the Organ Donation Advisory Committee, Pennsylvania Departments of Health, Education, and Transportation along with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's two organ procurement organizations, the Center for Organ Recovery & Education (CORE) and Gift of Life Donor Program, are committed to saving and restoring the lives of those in need of organ, cornea, and tissue transplantation by continuing to increase public awareness of the importance of becoming a registered donor.

THEREFORE, I, Tom Wolf, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby proclaim April 2021 as DONATE LIFE MONTH in Pennsylvania. I encourage all citizens to consider becoming an organ and tissue donor by placing the organ donor designation on their driver's license or state identification card, or registering online at <http://donatelifepa.org> and sharing this decision with their family.
