

The Hill has published an op-ed, <u>Why millions are failing college math — and how to fix it</u>, noting "For decades, mathematics — particularly college algebra — has functioned less as a bridge to opportunity than as a barrier to completion. Nationally, college algebra is one of the most common stumbling blocks to degree completion, with high failure and withdrawal rates that disproportionately affect first-generation and non-white students.





The University of Pennsylvania has released <u>free search guides aimed</u> <u>at helping students navigate the college search process</u>—for applying to Penn or any school. From narrowing down college list to keeping track of upcoming application deadlines, this series of guides will get students ready to apply to college.

Education Strategy Group's (ESG) new Building Better Outcomes: A District Playbook for Effective Postsecondary Data Practice offers a practical, district-centered guide to building a coherent, student-focused data ecosystem. This playbook sits squarely alongside both the recently-released definition of high-quality advising and the District Enabling Conditions Framework: leadership commitment, aligned infrastructure, and data-driven practice are all enabling conditions that allow students to receive advising that is personalized, equitable, and connected to real outcomes.

COLLEGE AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT


The National College Attainment Network (NCAN) has published <u>Six Findings on Americans' Views of Higher Education</u>, based on <u>New America</u>'s 9th annual <u>Varying Degrees survey</u> on higher education, which collected data from 1,600 adults with Democratic and Republican viewpoints to identify similarities and differences between the two groups across six key themes.

Edtrust has released <u>Mapping Postsecondary Pathways: Understanding State Student College Enrollment Trends.</u>

The <u>College Affordability and Transparency Center</u> was created by the **U.S. Department of Education** to meet requirements in the Higher Education Opportunity Act and to provide better information to student and parent consumers about college costs.



Georgetown University's Center on Education and the Workforce pondered whether obtaining a bachelor's degree is worth it. The evidence says yes: Prime-age workers with a bachelor's degree earn 70 percent more at the median than workers with a high school diploma alone. However, median earnings vary significantly by major for prime-age workers, from \$58,000 in education and public service fields to \$98,000



in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. The Major Payoff: Evaluating Earnings and Employment Outcomes Across Bachelor's Degrees provides insight into key outcomes associated with various undergraduate fields and majors for prime-age workers (ages 25–54) and recent college graduates (ages 22–26), including median earnings, the graduate degree earnings premium, and unemployment rates.
